There is serious concern about the pollution caused by vehicular emissions, untreated waste from industries like toxic water, poisonous gases which significantly affect health of both livestock and man. Thus, there is a need to address these problems at various levels. The World Health Organization (WHO) estimates that a very significant number of diseases facing mankind today occur due to prolonged exposure to environmental pollution. Improper management of solid waste is one of the main causes of environmental pollution Pollution increases not only due to increase in population with decrease in the available living space for each person. Unplanned construction and disturbing the ecology and natural drainage of water has taken a big toll of human life in Chennai. Unprecedented rain is due to climatic change. The change in climatic condition is attributed to greenhouse effect and carbon emission. Ice is melting on poles and the temperature is rising on poles more rapidly than any place on earth. This is creating a rise in water level creating danger for the coastal countries. Bangladesh is facing this problem when it is reported that around 20 lakh people took refuge in Dhaka due to submergence of lower area in sea.
