## **Section B- Reading**

Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow:

A. Tawang is one of the 16 administrative districts of Arunachal Pradesh. The district was carved out of the West Kameng district. West Kameng falls under the jurisdiction of Cuona County of Shannan Prefecture of the Tibet Autonomous Region. Bhutan borders Tawang to the west and Tibet towards the north. It is situated at a height of about 10000 feet, above sea level. Around 75% of the total population is considered "tribal", i.e. belonging to the native Monpa, Bhotia and Adi. The dominant ethnic group is the Monpa, who inhabit all of the 163 villages. The Takpa, a small tribal group, are found in small, scattered numbers in the West and the North. The tribals of this place depend on agriculture for a living. Owing to Tawang's cold climate, farmers breed yak and sheep. In winter, Tawang frequently experiences heavy snowfall. Prior to the construction of the Tawang Monastery, this place was traditionally inhabited by the Monpa people. They used to reign over the Mon Kingdom which stretched from Tawang to Sikkim. Bhutan and Tibet later absorbed the control of the Mon kingdom. The Tawang Monastery was founded by the Merak Lama Lodre Gyatso in 1681 in accordance with the wishes of the 5th Dalai Lama, Ngawang Lobsang Gyatso. The sixth Dalai Lama, Tsangyang Gyatso, was born in Tawang. Tawang was once a part of Tibet. The 1914 McMahon Line awarded Tawang to India. It came under effective Indian administration on February 12, 1951, when Major R Khating led Indian Army troops to relocate Chinese squatters. From then onwards, elections are held regularly and democratic state legislature has been elected peacefully. The Sino-Indian war of 1962, saw Tawang briefly falling under the Chinese control. The valiant last stand of Mahavir Chakra awardee Jaswant Singh Rawat took place in Tawang. After that, Tawang again came under Indian administration. In recent years, China has routinely voiced its claims on Tawang. Indian prime minister, Dr. Singh, has stated categorically that Tawang is an integral part of India. 

- 7. Spoon into the tube.
- 8. Tap gently so mixture settles to the bottom.
- 9. Let it dry overnight before using.
